## **ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN**

- 1. Saint Vincent and the Grenadines (Recipient) will implement the "Coastal and Marine Ecosystems Management Strengthening Project" (Project) through the Sustainable Development Unit (SDU) within the Ministry of Tourism, Civil Aviation, Sustainable Development and Culture (MoTCASDC). The Global Environmental Facility (GEF), through the International Development Association (Association) is expected to provide financing for the Project.
- 2. The Recipient, through MoTCASDC, shall implement material measures and actions so that the Project is implemented in accordance with the World Bank's Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP) sets out material measures and actions, any specific documents, or plans, as well as the timing for each of these.
- 3. The Recipient, through MoTCASDC, shall comply with the provisions of any other environmental and social (E&S) instruments required under the ESSs and referred to in this ESCP, which include the Environmental and Social Management Framework (ESMF), Process Framework (PF), Stakeholder Engagement Plan (SEP), Labor Management Procedures (LMP), as well as the timelines specified in the present ESCP and the listed environmental and social instruments. The environmental and social instruments referenced in the ESCP may be updated with the prior written agreement of the Association.
- 4. The Recipient is responsible for ensuring compliance with all requirements of the ESCP even when implementation of specific measures and actions is conducted by the Ministry, agency or unitreferenced in 1. above.
- Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP shall be monitored and reported to the Association by the Recipient, through MoTCASDC, as required by the ESCP and the conditions of the legal agreement.
- 6. As agreed by the Association and the Recipient, this ESCP may be revised from time to time during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of Project performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, the Recipient shall agree to the changes with the Association and shall update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP shall be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Association and the Permanent Secretary responsible for the MoTCASDC. The Recipient shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
- 7. Where Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, the Recipient, through MoTCASDC, shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts.
